Thursday, February 25th: ACE IT Day

- “ACE IT” Day held at The Career Academy (8800 “O” Street)
- The morning session will be held at 8:30 a.m.; the afternoon session will be held 1:00 p.m. We will communicate the room assignments for each session before this event. Attend the session you have pre-registered for. Check with your instructor if unsure about assigned session time.
- On this day, you will receive work preparedness “tools” to help prepare you for an interview as well as expectations as an intern when working in a professional setting.
- Bring a notepad and pen to jot down information.

Thursday, March 4th: Mock Interviews

- You or your instructor will be provided copies of the employers’ job descriptions. Review these carefully. This will help you have an insight into what the employers are looking for and give you ideas for your “elevator speech” at the Job Fair.

May 1: Job Offers

- Job offers are finalized by employers.
- Each employer will have its own hiring criteria. Most employers will ask you to come to their office for an interview. Your internship days and hours will be determined with your employer.
- Participating employers are seeking 10-20 interns.
- There are on average 40 registered students in 1st Job-Lincoln every year. This program is not meant to guarantee an internship; you must earn it. Just like the “real world” you are competing for a job. Bring your best to the Job Fair!

June – August: Internship

- You will be assigned a “buddy advocate” from 1st Job-Lincoln.
- Your buddy advocate will meet with you at least once at your job site and will be available to you during your internship should you have any questions or concerns.
